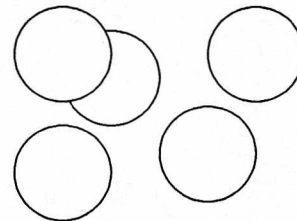


Proposed Realignment of District Tech Committees

- SIS Taskforce (temporary & quasi-independent)
- DE Taskforce (temporary)

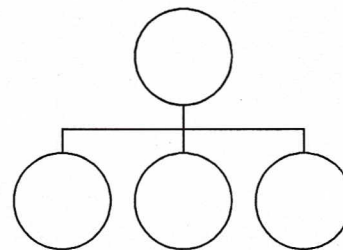


Proposal: Bring all IT-related committees into alignment under the oversight of a single planning and policy making committee.

Charge

- Create a formal, district IT strategic plan that establishes long-term goals and priorities
- Make recommendations on district-wide IT policy and procurement
- Coordinate infrastructure/hardware/software needs and initiatives

Reports: To Chancellor's Cabinet

TPPC Subcommittees & Taskforces (All report to TPPC)

District Technology Committee

Charge: Makes recommendations for the improvement of district-wide IT operational policies and procedures, establishes system infrastructure and equipment design, and writes and recommends district IT security policies

Members: IT Managers and specialists

services, accreditation standards, student registration and student success in online classes.

Members: Administrative, faculty and staff representatives

SIS Taskforce

Charge: Oversees implementation of new Student Information System

Members: Representatives of primary SIS user groups

Distance Education Committee

Charge: Addresses all DE issues, including course management systems, instructor training, online
