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- 1. Demonstration of Net Tutor** - The OEI will soon provide a new software/web based tutoring platform for use by all Calif. Community Colleges. Information about this program is located at <http://ccctechedge.org/news/miscellaneous/521-online-tutoring-services-offered-systemwide> - The committee reviewed the website, and discussed online tutoring. The cost of tutors through the OEI is \$25 per hour to LAMC, and this is too expensive. DEC will look at alternative solutions to use of online tutors, but the NetTutor platform is excellent and will provide easy access and use by both our college tutors and our students who need to receive tutoring. The Dean of Student Success perhaps has money allotted for tutoring in his student success funding, and further discussions with him will take place to see if and when LAMC might be able to implement online tutoring with the use of the Net Tutor program.

### **3. Discuss Student Readiness to take an online class (OEI - Quest for Online Success –**

The DE Coordinator discussed the OEI initiative to assist online students achieve success in their online classes. The OEI is developing online orientation called "Quest for Success" which is being developed, in part, by one of our LACCD Sister Colleges, WLAC.

The OEI imbedded online orientation will be made available to California Community Colleges in the near future. It will [include the following elements](#) - It will also include an Assessment for new online students to take, called **Smarter Measure** which will help students assess if they are ready to take online classes. The Quest for Success online orientation will include"

The modules will include interactive media and assessment/quizzes

- The package may include SmarterMeasure
- The modules are being developed in Moodle, but will be CMS agnostic
- The modules will be available free of charge
- Here are the modules
  - 1) Intro to Online Learning
  - 2) Getting Tech Ready
  - 3) Organizing for Online Success
  - 4) Online Study Skills & Time Mgt
  - 5) Communication Skills for Online Learning
  - 6) Online Reading Strategies
  - 7) Getting Started

Smarter Measure Assessment to be soon imbedded in our online classes at LAMC will assist our online students. A description of Smarter Measure is provided at <http://www.smartermeasure.com/about/assessment-overview/>.

Here is a Description of SmarterMeasure

The SmarterMeasure Learning Readiness Indicator, is a web-based assessment which measures a learner's readiness for succeeding in an online and/or technology rich learning program based on non-cognitive indicators of success. SmarterMeasure indicates the degree to which an individual student possesses attributes, skills and knowledge that contribute to success in learning. All seven components of SmarterMeasure are grounded in theoretical research and practice. The seven components of SmarterMeasure are:

- Individual Attributes - motivation, procrastination, willingness to ask for help, etc.
- Life Factors - Availability of time, support from family and employers, finances, etc.
- Learning styles - Based on the multiple intelligences model
- Technical Competency - Skills with using technology Technical Knowledge - Knowledge of technology terms
- On-screen Reading Rate and Recall
- Typing Speed and Accuracy
